<p>An important part of Foundation Stage is for children to develop respect for their own culture and beliefs and those of other people (family traditions).</p> <p>Although this sounds very advance it is as simple as: "When I went to Sarah's house to play we had to take our shoes off when we went in. We will be moving on to looking at number bonds to 10.</p> <p>We will be moving our 2D shape work forward by looking and describing the properties of shapes.</p> <p>At the end of June we will be harvesting our potatoes that we have grown. We will be sorting these into size order and weight.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">People Who Help Us</p> 	<p>We will continue to practise our Phase 2 and Phase 3 phonemes, tricky words, high frequency words.</p> <p>We will continue to orally blend and segment words which will aid the children in their early reading and writing.</p> <p>These skills will be put into practice in our weekly guided reading and writing sessions.</p> <p>In our weekly guided reading sessions the children will be looking at and discussing the features of non-fiction texts and how these differ from stories.</p> <p>The children will be writing their own set of instructions after helping us make beans on toast!</p> <p>To support our work in KUW the children will be making their own non-fiction booklet.</p>

<p>The children will continue to make things using 'junk' and we will be introducing new materials to them e.g. shells, coloured wire, wool, different fabrics and art straws.</p> <p>We have a range of musical instruments and sound makers that the children have access to and we will be encouraging them to find different ways of playing them and creating quite and loud sounds.</p> <p>Dabchicks and Magpies will both be performing in their class Act of Worship.</p>	<p>This term we will be focusing on ball skills. Manipulative Skills e.g. to trap a ball with hands. To bounce and catch a ball.</p> <p>At the end of the year we the children will be taking part in the Key Stage 1 Sports Day Festival. We will have the opportunity to demonstrate the physical development skills that we have learnt this year.</p>	<p>This term our topic will be 'People Who Help Us'. We will be visited by the vets from Wittam Lodge, the Dental Nurse, the Coast Guard and Simon the painter and decorator. We will be visiting the Police Station and the Library.</p> <p>The children will be programming a BeeBot to move around a street/treasure map. This will reinforce our positional work in PSRN.</p> <p>In our computer sessions the children will learn how to log on to the system and locate their favourite programmes.</p>
